

Canon Collins Scholarships for Postgraduate Study in South Africa, 2016-2018

Canon Collins Trust is pleased to offer a scholarship to study postgraduate program in the South Africa. Scholars from Angola, Botswana, Lesotho, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa, Swaziland, Zambia, and Zimbabwe are eligible to apply for these scholarships.

Canon Collins Trust seeks to support exceptional individuals who are committed to social justice in Southern Africa and for whom a postgraduate qualification is an essential tool in working to create an open and just society.

Canon Collins Educational & Legal Assistance Trust through its postgraduate and research funding, project grants and international events programme, its unique approach cultivates a space where activism and research meet.

If applicants are non-native English speaking students they must provide evidence of their English language ability. The following tests are accepted for entry into degree-level courses: International English Language Testing System (IELTS) (Academic); Pearson Test of English (PTE) (Academic); Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English (CAE); Cambridge Proficiency (CPE); TOEFL iBT (internet based) and Trinity ISE.

Course Level: Scholarships are available for pursuing postgraduate programme.

Study Subject: In 2017 the trust will be making awards only to those studying in three areas:

- Justice, which includes Law, Economics, Politics and the Environment
- Education policy and practice
- Humanities, which includes Literature, History, Anthropology and the Arts
- Please only apply if your program of study falls into one of these disciplines.

Interdisciplinary courses and doctoral studies may sometimes defy easy categorization.

Applicants are urged to use their judgement in assessing whether to apply. But applications that clearly do not fall within these areas (for example MBAs, medical sciences, sports sciences, applied sciences) will not be considered for an award.

Scholarship Award: In 2017 most awards will be valued at R65, 000 for each year of study at Masters and Ph.D. level. In exceptional cases, we may offer up to R100, 000 per year. The trust supports both full and part-time study and will consider applications from those who wish to study by distance learning.

Scholarship can be taken in South Africa

Eligibility: In addition, to be considered for a scholarship under these programme applicants must:

- be a national of, or have refugee status in, one of the following countries: Angola, Botswana, Lesotho, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa, Swaziland, Zambia, Zimbabwe
- be normally resident in one of the above countries
- be in possession of a good first degree (minimum second class, upper division or equivalent) or about to graduate in the year of application
- Be studying or applying to study at a South African university.

Nationality: Scholars from Angola, Botswana, Lesotho, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa, Swaziland, Zambia, and Zimbabwe are eligible to apply for these scholarships.

College Admission Requirement

Entrance Requirements: Applicants must be in possession of a good first degree (minimum second class, upper division or equivalent) or about to graduate in the year of application.

English language Requirements: If applicants are non-native English speaking applicant they must provide evidence of their English language ability.

Test Requirements: The tests that are accepted for entry into degree-level courses: International English Language Testing System (IELTS) (Academic); Pearson Test of English (PTE) (Academic); Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English (CAE); Cambridge Proficiency (CPE); TOEFL iBT (internet based) and Trinity ISE.

Scholarships in South Africa

How to Apply: The mode of application is online. All sections of the form need to be complete before the system will allow the application form to be submitted. Information can be saved and the application form edited until the applicant chooses to submit. All applicants are required to upload the following supporting documentation:

- Copy of degree certificates, if available
- Certified academic transcripts
- ID document (the following are acceptable: passport, birth certificate, driver's license)

Applicants may also need to submit:

- Proof of refugee status, if applicable
- Two recent pay slips, if currently employed
- Ph.D. proposal if applicable.
