

The university recently held a meeting with the Ministry of Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety, and Security. During this meeting, all universities were instructed to deregister students residing in the country unlawfully. The Ministry requires feedback by Monday, 30 September 2024. This announcement serves to notify you that you will be deregistered before this date.

If your name is on the deregistration list, please take the following actions:

- **Currently studying in your home country:** Email your student number, email address, and the country where you are currently located.
- Already have a study permit: Forward a copy of your endorsed study permit along with your student number.
- Married to a Namibian or have permanent residence: Provide a copy of your marriage certificate or permanent residence permit (PRP).

Please note that the Ministry has made it clear that students on a work permit are not legally allowed to study. You cannot hold both a work and study permit simultaneously unless the Chief of Immigration has granted special permission.

Employment Permits (EP) and Temporary Residence Permits (TRP) cannot be used as student permits unless the applicant has applied for a change of condition through the Immigration Selection Board (ISB).

An email has been sent to the students scheduled for deregistration. If you did not receive the list, please contact Ms Alma Kiimba for assistance before Thursday, as deregistration will take place on Friday, 27 September 2024.
