8. EVALUATION CRITERIA (ANNEXURE 4)

8.1 The evaluation of proposals will be carried out as per the criteria indicated in Annexure 4 of the bidding documents.

9. DECIDING AWARD OF CONTRACT

9.1 The consultants' qualifications and experience shall be considered the paramount requirement. The proposals will be evaluated based on a maximum of 70 marks for Technical Proposals and 30 marks for Financial Proposals. Proposals from Consultants should score at least 70 marks for the Technical Proposals to be retained for further consideration.

9.2 Only those Consultants scoring a total of 70 marks on the overall assessment shall be considered for the assignment. Negotiations will start with the Consultant scoring the highest marks. If negotiation is unsuccessful, negotiation will move to the next best-ranked Consultant until an agreement is reached. Should you be contacted for negotiations, you must be prepared to furnish the detailed cost breakdown and other clarifications to the proposals submitted by you, as may be required to adjudge the reasonableness of your pricing proposals.

10. RIGHTS A PUBLIC ENTITY

10.1 Please note that the Namibia University of Science and Technology is not bound to select any consultants submitting proposals.

10.2 Please note that the cost of preparing a proposal and negotiating a contract, including any costs, is not reimbursable as a direct cost of the assignment.

11. DURATION OF ASSIGNMENT

11.1 It is estimated that the minimum duration of the assignment shall be **one (1) year**. The Consultants should base their financial proposal on these figures. The rate proposed in your submission will be applied in case the duration of the assignment is to be extended.

12. VALIDITY OF PROPOSAL

12.1 You are requested to hold your Proposal valid for **180** working days from the deadline for submission of proposals, during which you will maintain your proposed price without change. The Namibia University of Science and Technology will do its best to finalise the agreement within this period.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

PART 1. BACKGROUND

The Namibia University of Science and Technology (NUST), through the Department of Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET), is implementing the IGNITE GH2 Project funded by the European Union under the Global Gateway Initiative. The project is implemented in partnership with NamWater Corporation Ltd, Namibia Institute of Mining and Technology (NIMT), Hyphen Hydrogen Energy (Pty) Ltd and Zhero Molecules (Pty) Ltd.

The project aims to upskill 685 unemployed TVET graduates in six occupational areas and upgrade qualifications to National Qualifications Framework (NQF) Levels 4, 5 and 6. The project is to be implemented from November 2025 to October 2027 under EU Grant Agreement No. GA 81320285.

In accordance with TEI OP-VET monitoring and evaluation requirements under the EU Global Gateway framework, NUST is required to appoint an independent external Monitoring Service Provider to conduct Tracer Study data collection for Outcome Indicators 6 and 7. The purpose is to objectively measure employment outcomes and improvements in working conditions of project beneficiaries after completion of training.

PART 2. THE SCOPE OF WORK

The Consultant/consulting firm shall act as an independent external monitoring service provider and undertake tracer study and related monitoring activities throughout the project period. The scope of work includes:

Project-Level Data Collection and Quality Assurance

- Develop a project-specific research design and data collection plan.
- Designing and implementing statistically representative sampling methodologies in line with TEI OP-VET requirements
- Conducting tracer studies and feedback surveys using approved questionnaires and digital data collection tools
- Recruit, train and supervise enumerators.
- Conduct telephone and/or face-to-face interviews and digital surveys.
- Implement data quality assurance measures throughout data collection activities.

Data Aggregation, Analysis and Reporting

- Conduct routine data quality checks.
- Clean, aggregate and analyse collected data.
- Prepare datasets in TEI OP-VET reporting formats.
- Identify and resolve data collection challenges.
- Produce reports and analysis required for project monitoring and donor reporting.

- Ensure compliance with Namibia data protection requirements and the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

The engagement will support monitoring of the following indicators:

- Employment outcomes of graduates after completing training (Indicator ID 06).
- Improved working conditions of beneficiaries (Indicator ID 07).
- Relevance of training programmes to beneficiaries (Indicator ID 05).
- Satisfaction of private sector stakeholders regarding training relevance (Indicator ID 4.3).

PART 3. FACILITIES TO BE PROVIDED BY NUST

NUST will:

- Provide access to project-related information required for implementation.
- Facilitate coordination with the MER Expert, Principal Investigator and relevant project stakeholders.
- Provide TEI OP-VET reporting requirements, indicator definitions and standard survey instruments.
- Provide access to project beneficiary databases and training schedules where required.
- Review and approve deliverables submitted by the Service Provider.

PART 4. CONTRACT DURATION AND FEES:

1) Duration of the initial contract and assignment

The contract's duration shall be for one (1) year or as agreed upon by the two parties.

2) Fees

The contract shall cover the period of implementation of the IGNITE GH2 project, from project baseline through endline data collection activities, subject to project funding availability. The Local External Monitoring Service Provider should provide a 12-month plan of activities.

3) Payment

Payments will be made to the Service Provider based on key deliverables completed and signed off by the MER Expert and Project Investigator. The Service Provider shall submit the invoice and accompanying supporting documents required by the University before the 5th of the month. No advance payments will be made.

PART 4. CONSULTANT KEY DELIVERABLES

The **Consultant** will be required to deliver the following services:

- a) Inception report including research design and data collection plan.
- b) Sampling methodology and sampling framework.
- c) Enumerator recruitment and training records.

- d) Baseline tracer study datasets and associated reports.
- e) Endline tracer study datasets and associated reports.
- f) Cleaned and anonymised datasets suitable for TEI OP-VET reporting.
- g) Periodic data quality assurance reports.
- h) Indicator analysis and interpretation reports.
- i) Data files and supporting documentation compatible with the TEI OP-VET digital M&E system.
- j) Ad-hoc monitoring and reporting outputs as requested by the project

PART 6: REPORTING AND COMMUNICATION

The Consultant will report to the MER and Project Investigator and is expected to provide regular progress updates. Key milestones and reporting dates will be agreed upon at the start of the assignment.

PART 7: CONSULTANT QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

The consultant/consulting firm should possess:

- a) A minimum of three (3) years of experience and expertise in providing quantitative data collection services for donor-funded development projects. **(Attached list of previous and current relevant clientele and at least three (3) contactable references letter similar services within the last three years). The reference letter must be on the company's letterhead, giving reference, with dates as to when a similar assignment was done and contact details of the person giving the reference.**
- b) Experience in conducting stratified random sampling and survey implementation.
- c) Ability to perform data cleaning, management and anonymisation in accordance with GDPR standards.
- d) Ability to conduct data collection in Windhoek, Okahandja, Arandis and Keetmanshoop.
- e) Capacity to conduct interviews in English and relevant local languages.
- f) Advanced data management and reporting capability using Excel or similar tools.
- g) Experience with EU-funded programmes and TEI OP-VET systems will be an added advantage.
- h) Independence from NUST, NIMT, NamWater Corporation Ltd, Hyphen Hydrogen Energy (Pty) Ltd and Zhero Molecules Walvis Bay (Pty) Ltd, including no existing contractual or institutional relationships with these entities.
- i) Substantial experience in qualitative data collection as the Lead Consultant and the team members to be assigned to this contract **(Attached CV of the Lead Consultant and team members of the team members to be assigned to this project)**

PART 8: EXPERIENCE OF PROPOSED CONSULTING TEAM MEMBERS

The Consultant is required to propose a team for this engagement, managed by a single lead consultant. The team members will have the skills and experience necessary to undertake the range of key deliverables in this TOR. The expertise essential for the team is as follows:

- d) Excellent English communication (oral and written), report writing, stakeholder engagement, and presentation skills.
- e) Proven experience in leading multidisciplinary teams and successfully delivering similar assignments within the required timelines.
- f) Excellent English communication (oral and written), report writing, and presentation skills.

The consultant is expected to submit a detailed financial proposal, including consultancy fees, disbursement including all projected expenses, and any other costs associated with the conduct **tracer studies and related monitoring activities**. The contractor must provide, in addition to completing F-4 form of the bid document, an official proposal on their company overhead of all costs related to this assignment.

PART 10: CONFIDENTIALITY

The consultant will maintain strict confidentiality concerning all matters related to the organization, its data and processes.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION FOR CONSULTANT

PROPOSALS

The interested consultants should submit a detailed technical proposal outlining the approach, methodology, and timelines. The technical proposal must include all the consultant's relevant qualifications, experience, and references.

The financial proposal must include all costs associated with the conduct tracer studies and related monitoring activities process.

1) TECHNICAL PROPOSAL

- a) **Adequacy and quality of the proposed methodology and work plan in responding to the Terms of Reference (TORs)** - The Consultant must describe how it will deliver the demands of the ToR; providing a detailed description of the essential performance characteristics, reporting conditions, and quality assurance mechanisms that will be put in place while demonstrating that the proposed methodology will be appropriate to the key deliverable of NUST.
- b) **Qualifications and competence of key consultants for the service:** i) Names and qualifications of the key personnel that will perform the services indicating who is the Team Leader, who is supporting, etc. ii) CVs demonstrating qualifications must be submitted (**Form F-2**); and iii) Written confirmation from each person that they are available for the entire duration of the contract.

Financial Proposal

They must include a **detailed cost breakdown as per key deliverables**, including but not limited to estimated total cost and provisions for contingencies (**Form may be amended as appropriate**). **The financial proposal should be inclusive of ad hoc service fees for the one-year contract. The contractor must also provide an official quotation on its company letterhead.**

Submission of Proposals

ARTICLE I

SCOPE OF SERVICES

- 1.1 The services to be performed by the Consultant under this Contract (hereinafter called the Services) are those described in the Terms of Reference attached hereto as **Annexure I** to the present Contract. The Terms of Reference shall form an integral part of this Contract.

ARTICLE II

COMMENCEMENT OF SERVICES AND DURATION OF CONTRACT

- 2.1 The Consultant shall commence the Services on *[date]* upon signature of the present Contract, and shall carry out the Services in a manner most suited to the requirements of the Contract and in accordance with the schedules and time limits established under the Terms of Reference (**Annexure I**) or indicated by the Public Entity.

DUTIES OF THE CONSULTANT

- 3.2 The Consultant shall:
- (a) regularly report to and obtain direction and guidance from the Public Entity on all matters arising from or relating to the present Contract.
 - (b) promptly comply with such instructions as may be issued from time to time by the Public Entity in connection with the performance of the services.
- 3.3 The Consultant shall perform the services to the satisfaction of the Public Entity in accordance with the Terms of Reference and at such intervals as the Public Entity may require.
- 3.4 The Consultant shall keep and maintain accurate and complete accounts in respect of expenditure incurred under the present Contract in such form and detail as shall be satisfactory to the Public Entity for the purposes of making payment or settlement under the Contract, where applicable.
- 3.5 The Consultant shall meet the cost of any insurance and/or medical examination or treatment required by him/her in the course of performing the services.
- 3.6 The Consultant shall seek and obtain any visas or residence permits that he/she may require to carry out the services and perform his/her obligations under the present Contract. The Public Entity shall, as necessary, assist the Consultant in obtaining such visas and/or permits.

ARTICLE IV
PAYMENT FOR THE SERVICES

- 4.1 The Public Entity shall pay to the Consultant, in respect of the services, the various amounts specified in Annex II to this Contract (hereinafter referred to as the "Contract Amount").
- 4.2 The Contract Amounts shall be paid to the Consultant in accordance with the modalities specified in Annex II to the present Contract, which forms an integral part hereof.

ARTICLE V
CONFIDENTIALITY AND OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

- 5.1 All documents, statistics, reports, data, and other information provided, created, obtained, or made available to the Consultant in connection with or by virtue of the present Contract, shall be treated as confidential by the Consultant, and the Consultant shall not be entitled to use or make copies of them for any purpose that is not related to the present Contract.
- 5.2 The documents, statistics, reports, and data under the preceding paragraph shall, upon the completion of Services or termination of this Contract, be promptly returned to the Public Entity.
- 5.3 Any study, report, or other material, graphic, software, or otherwise, prepared by the Consultant for Public Entity under the Contract shall belong to and remain the property of the Public Entity. The Consultant may retain a copy of such documents and software.

ARTICLE VI
ASSIGNMENT AND SUB-CONTRACTING

- 6.1 Except with the prior written consent of the Public Entity, the Consultant shall not:
- (a) in whole or in part, assign, transfer or otherwise dispose of his/her rights or obligations under the present Contract.
 - (b) sub-contract, or otherwise transfer responsibility for, the whole or any part of the Services.

ARTICLE VII
LIABILITY OF THE CONSULTANT

- 7.1.1 The Consultant shall abide by and take all measures necessary to enable him/her to comply with all laws and regulations in force in any place where the Services are to be wholly or partially performed.
- 7.2 The Consultant shall be fully liable for the consequences of any error or omission on his/her part or for any damage caused by negligence on his/her part in carrying out the Services or performing his/her obligations under the present Contract.

ARTICLE VIII
FORCE MAJEURE

- 8.1 Neither Party to the present Contract shall be responsible for any delay or failure to perform the obligations under the Contract if the delay or failure is attributable to force majeure.
- 8.2 In the event of *force majeure* which delays performance of the whole or any part of the present Contract for more than sixty (60) days, either Party shall have the right, by notice in writing to the other party, to terminate the Contract.
- 8.3 For purposes of this Article, an event of force majeure shall mean an unforeseen and unavoidable event beyond the reasonable control and contemplation of the party invoking the existence of such event, and which impacts directly on the discharge of the obligation under the Contract.

ARTICLE IX
TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

- 9.1 The Public Entity may, upon giving not less than [30] days' notice in writing to the Consultant, terminate the present Contract for cause if the Consultant has failed to perform the Services or to comply with his/her other obligations under the Contract.

- 9.2 The Public Entity may, at its option, terminate this Contract when it is in the interest of or for the convenience of the Public Entity to do so, provided that the Consultant shall in that event be given a notice of not less than *[30 days]* days of such termination.
- 9.3 The Consultant may terminate the present Contract if the Public Entity has, within a period of forty-five (45) days after the due date, failed to pay any amount due to him/her in respect of which no dispute has arisen.
- 9.4 The Parties hereto may by mutual agreement terminate this Contract.
- 9.5 If the present Contract is terminated under this Article, the Public Entity shall be liable only for payment, in accordance with the payment provisions of the Contract, for the Services actually rendered prior to the effective date of termination, together with such other amounts incidental to the termination as may be reasonable in the circumstances.

ARTICLE X
DISPUTE SETTLEMENT

- 10.1 Any dispute arising out of or in connection with the present Contract shall unless it is amicably settled, be decided upon by the Accounting Officer of the Public Entity who shall transmit his decision in writing to both Parties.
- 10.2 Any dispute between the Parties as to matters arising pursuant to this Contract which cannot be settled amicably within sixty (60) days after receipt by one Party of the other Party's request for such amicable settlement may be submitted by either Party for arbitration under the applicable law.

ARTICLE XI
MODIFICATION OR AMENDMENT

- 11.1 Except by mutual agreement in writing between the Parties, no change, modification, or amendment shall be made to the present Contract.
- 11.2 Notwithstanding the preceding paragraph, the Public Entity may at any time order or require changes in the scope of the Services. If such changes add to or reduce the cost of the Services, the Contract Amount shall be adjusted accordingly.

ARTICLE XII
EFFECTIVE DATE

- 12.1 The present Contract shall enter into force on the date of its signature by both parties.
- 12.2 Unless terminated under Article VIII or IX above, the present Contract shall expire upon completion of the Services and the discharge of all obligations arising out of or under the Contract.

ARTICLE XIII
CHANNEL OF COMMUNICATIONS AND NOTICE

- 13.1 For the purposes of the present Contract, the authorized representative of the Public Entity shall be the Accounting Officer of the Public Entity.
- 13.2 Any communication, notification, submission, notice, demand or request under the present Contract shall be deemed to have been duly transmitted if it shall have been delivered by hand, mail, or facsimile by either party to the other at the appropriate address indicated below, or at such other address as that other party may have indicated:
